I am enclosing herewith the monthly report in respect of Ministry of Coal for the month of October, 2018. Important achievements for the month of October, 2018 are as following:

- Overall coal production of CIL has grown from 46.2 MT to 49.8 MT i.e. growth of 8 % as compared to corresponding month of last year.
- Overall coal offtake of CIL has grown from 48.3 MT to 50.0 MT i.e. growth of 4% as compared to corresponding month of last year.
- Coal dispatch by CIL to Power Sector as a whole increased from 39.6 MT to 41.5 MT, an increase of 5% as compared to corresponding month of last year.
- Outstanding dues by Power Sector to CIL as on 31.10.2018 are Rs. 8,010.45 crore.

- 3. Govt. of Jharkhand may expedite the shifting of R.S.P. College, Jharia to a suitable location
- 3. During 16th HPCC meeting held on 23rd August, 2018, DC Dhanbad informed that land acquisition for RSP College is still pending with BCCL. It was mentioned that after getting the land, JRDA will construct a permanent college within 2 (two) years. BCCL was advised to take necessary immediate action. Matter is under process.
- 4. MoRTH may take up realignment of 300 m stretch of NH 2 in Raniganj area expeditiously and hand over the stretch to ECL.
- 4. As discussed during 15th HPCC meeting in regard to 300 m stretch of NH 2 under unstable area, a committee was constituted under DG, DGMS with DDG central zone and DDG Eastern zone to examine all available reports and reassess the danger associated and need for shifting/strengthening the road. Accordingly, three consecutive meetings were held under the Chairmanship of DG,DGMS i.e. on 21.03.2018 at DGMS office, Sitarampur and on 19.04.2018 & 17.05.2018 at DGMS office, Dhanbad where representatives from ECL and NHAI were present. Due to non-availability of authentic mine plan to calculate the actual area of extended u/g workings to ascertain the void area to be filled up, DG expressed his doubt about long

term stabilization of the area through back filling technique.

DG opined that further investigation by a Scientific Body may be engaged to study the condition beneath the NH-2 and may suggest measures if any, to ensure long term stability of the unstable portion of the NH-2 road.

As per suggestion/opinion of DG, DGMS five scientific/research institutes i.e. IIT,Kharagpur; IIEST, Shibpur; NIT, Rourkela; ISM, Dhanbad and BHU were requested on 17.08.2018 to submit scope of work along with cost involvement to carry out the scientific study in connection with assessment of the condition of road beneath the NH-2 and suggest measures necessary for restoration of full proof stabilization of the affected stretches of NH-2 road for long term duration. As no response/communication has been received from anyone within the stipulated period, 2nd request has been made again on 18.09.2018 to submit the offer within the time period of 28.09.2018 for taking decision on the matter.

On 27.09.2018 two premiere institutes i.e. IIT, Kharagpur and IIEST, Shibpur have submitted offer along with scope of work and financial implications to carry out the study work.

IIT, Kharagpur has quoted the lower rate.

In a meeting with DDG, EZ on 04.10.2018 emphasis was given for full-proof stabilization of long term duration along with certification from concerned agency.

Examination by the concerned dept. at ECL,HQ level is going on in regard to matter of release of fund prior to study work as per terms and condition of the offer submitted by IIT, Kharagpur.

5. The alternative road suggested by BCCL between Godhur and Putki may be brought to proper standards and handed over to NHAI so that the corresponding section of NH 32 can be handed over by NHAI to BCCL.

5. NH-32 was not included in the approved Master Plan. However, it was decided that NHAI is required to switch over to newly constructed part between Godhur and Putki, and hand over the fire affected part to BCCL.

BCCL requested the Executive Engineer, NH Divn, Dhanbad for inclusion of the clause (mentioned below) in the draft lease agreement submitted by NH Divn. The clause is:- "The lease rent will be payable to NH Division, Dhanbad with effect from the date when physical possession free from all encumbrances and encroachment of the total land / patch in question is handed over to BCCL."

Draft lease agreement forwarded by National Highway Wing, RCD, Jharkhand yet to be finalized by MORTH, Govt. of India.

BCCL are in regular persuasion of the matter with NH division.

Information on the 8. specific steps taken the by Ministry/Departme nt for utilization of Space the based Technology tools and applications in Government and Development.

Three project were identified for the future areas of use of Space Technology in CIL

- (i) Air Pollution Monitoring: CMPDI in collaboration with NRSC has taken up an R&D project for regional air quality monitoring in coalfield areas using satellite data. The project has started in September 2017 after signing an agreement with NRSC. It is under progress.
- (ii) Coal Mine Fire Mapping and subsidence mapping. CMPDI is already mapping coal mine fire with the help of thermal satellite imagery regularly since year 2012. However, collaborative project with NRSC can be initiated for aerial flying using thermal sensor which can be used to map coal mine fire more accurately. It may be mentioned that NRSC is also doing coal mine fire mapping using satellite data for BCCL
- (iii) Capacity Building in CMPDIL for SAR interferometry towards Fire and Subsidence Mapping. Capacity building in CMPDI for SAR interferometry has already been done. Two executives from CMPDI were sent to NRSC for training in SAR Interferometry
